Health & Safety Updates



NPS Health Pillars

- 1. Face Coverings ALL adults & students
- 2. Hand Hygiene
- 3. Health Self-Assessment
 - Every morning, an adult at home should check children for symptoms of COVID-19
 - Stay home if sick, even if vaccinated

NPS Health Pillars

NPS Health Self-assessment Tool

- Do you/your child have any of the following symptoms?
 - Fever (100F or higher), chills, shaking chills
 - Cough (not due to other known causes, such as a chronic cough)
 - Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath
 - New loss of taste or smell
 - Muscle aches or body aches
 - Sore throat (when in combination with other symptoms)
 - Headache (when in combination with other symptoms)
 - Nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea (when in combination with other symptoms)
 - Fatigue (when in combination with other symptoms)
 - Nasal congestion or runny nose (not due to other known causes, such as allergies and when in combination with other symptoms)
- 2. Have you/your child been told by a public health official to isolate or quarantine?

If your answer to either of the questions above is 'yes', stay home and do not come to school.

- Notify the school nurse, building principal, or principal's designee
- Staff should also follow standard procedures for reporting an absence
- If symptomatic, contact your health care provider for assessment and testing. As always, if you are experiencing a medical emergency, call 911.

Testing Strategies

- Routine Covid Screening testing weekly for asymptomatic students & staff
- Symptomatic testing: Rapid testing for students & staff who develop symptoms at school.
- Test & Stay (Close contact testing): Close contacts will receive a daily rapid test performed for at least 5 days following exposure by the school nurse.
 - Designed so close contacts can stay in school vs. quarantining at home and missing school

Students will clean their hands...

- when they enter & leave a classroom
- ★ before & after eating
- ★ after using the bathroom
- ★ before & after using shared materials



Arrival & Dismissal Procedures

Arrival

- Students may enter the building at 8:10am
 - K-2 come through front door
 - 3-5 come through back door
- Entry points and hallways will be monitored by staff during arrival time.
- Students must wear masks to enter the building.
- Students should bring an extra mask to school, which they will keep in their bags.



Arrival & Dismissal Procedures

Bus Riders

- Bus riders will be greeted by staff upon arrival and remain outside (Inclement weather room TBD)
- Children enter their assigned door and proceed to classroom.

Late Arrival

- Students buzz into the main entrance after 8:25am
- Students go right to their classroom and teacher mark them tardy up until 8:35am
- After 8:35am, students report to the office for a late pass.
- All teachers send attendance at 8:35am

Arrival: First 2 Weeks of School

September 9-17:

→ All teachers will come out to meet their students in the grade-level arrival location at 8:05am. Parents may wait with their children or wave goodbye once they are with their teacher. When teachers have their entire class, they will escort the students to their classrooms.

Beginning Monday, September 20th:

→ All teachers will remain in their classrooms and children will wait at their arrival location. Parents are strongly encouraged to wait with with children as supervision will be limited. The first bell rings at 8:10am. At that time, all children walk into the school independently. Teachers will greet their students in their classrooms.

Late Arrival to School

If a student arrives late to school, they should:

- Use the buzzer at the front entrance.
- 2. Sign in through the main office.
- Go directly to their classroom, check in with their teacher, and wash their hands!

Early Dismissal

If children are dismissed by parent/caregiver:

- Parent/caregiver buzz into the main entrance and check in with the office.
- Ms. Lacey will ask the parent/caregiver to sign-out child, call to the classroom for child to come to office to be dismissed.
- The child will wash or sanitize their hands, gather materials, and go to main office door
- Parent/caregiver will wait outside the main door for child to exit



Student Materials & Belongings

Classroom materials & recess equipment will be shared.

Students will wash their hands **before & after** using any shared materials.

Routine cleaning and disinfecting of surfaces and materials in place.

Some supplies will go back & forth everyday:

- ★ Mask wear a clean one each day
- ★ Extra mask
- ★ Refillable water bottle



Lunch/Snack

- Outdoors We will prioritize outdoor eating, including tents, whenever possible
- Masks Masks are removed indoors only to eat. Masks are not required outdoors.
- Seating If outdoors, students can bring a towel or mat to sit on; If indoors, students stay seated. Quiet talking is allowed.
- Ventilation Windows & doors open wherever possible in indoor eating spaces. Ventilation is maximized & air filtration added as needed.
- Cafeteria Seating Rectangular 12-seat tables will have 50% capacity (3 students per side staggered).

Snacks and Drinking Water

During snack, each student will sit at their assigned seat or designated area.

When it is time to eat, students take off their masks.

Students wash/sanitize their hands before AND after eating.

All students should bring their own

water bottles to school.

Water fountains are closed, but "bottle filling stations" are open





Visitors & Dropping Off Items

Visitors will have limited access to the school building during school hours.

- Parents are not permitted to volunteer in the school.
- Consistent with practices last year, aftercare staff, pre-service educators, and other
 outside service providers that are a part of our education programs will continue to be
 permitted in the buildings and will follow NPS health and safety protocols.

If a parent/guardian/other adult must visit the building, they must wear a mask & maintain social distancing while on school property.

Go to the office to sign the visitor log & confirm that they are symptom free.

Adults may drop off forgotten items to students.

- Ring the doorbell & state that they are dropping off a forgotten item.
- Ms. Lacey or other Underwood staff will retrieve the item from the doorway unless directed otherwise
